



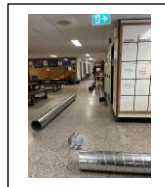

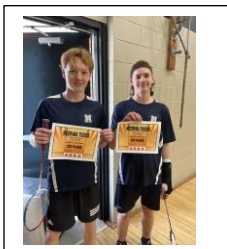
### MCI SV GIRLS VOLLEYBALL

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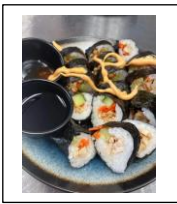
## AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGIES

Our Automotive Technology program had another great year running three groups of students through first and second semesters. Twenty-nine students in grade 9 exploring Technical Vocational Education where they learned about welding, hand tools and shop equipment usage and automotive repair. Fourteen students in grade 10 learned about Automotive Maintenance. These classes were run one once a day for an hour.

Seven students signed up for our all-day learning sessions running daily to learn about automotive systems and practice repair and maintenance procedures. This program is part of the Automotive Technician Journeyman training program where students can attain level one status after completing the program if they meet the criteria set up by the MB Apprenticeship standards.

## STUDENT LEADERSHIP
